



Syllabus

Each level takes approximately 12 – 18 months.

At Tanzeel, a great deal of importance is given to the correct recitation of the Qurʻān. The first stage is learning how to read the Arabic script. This is done by means of teaching the Arabic alphabet and rules of basic pronunciation using a text known as the Qāʻidah.

Every care is taken to explain to the students each stage of learning to read Arabic. The aim is to complete the Qāʻidah over an average time of 12 - 18 months. After completion of the Qāʻidah, the students progress to recite the Juz ʻAmmā and then progress to begin reciting the Qurʻān. This transition takes 18 – 24 months.

Tajweed

Makharīj (correct pronunciation) is emphasized at the Qawāid level, while more complex rules of reading and reciting (Tajwīd) are taught at Juz Amm and the Quran. A student completing their studies at Tanzeel attains a very high standard of Tajwīd (the art of reciting the Qurʻān proficiently and correctly).

Hifdhul Qurʻan

Hifdh is introduced gradually at each level with the aim of children either memorizing the whole Qurʻan or memorizing and retaining as much as they can. At Tanzeel, we emphasize retention and revision over completion, which we regard as a lifetime endeavor.

Dua & Salah

- Children start memorizing basic dua from age 5 and work through the Tanzeel Salah & Dua series, which covers most of the prayers and supplications needed for everyday life. The books highlight the excellence of using the duas to help motivate their regular use.
- At level one, they learn orally from the teacher without transliteration, and once they can read independently, they memorize from the text. We never use transliteration.

Islamic Studies

- In this component, many essential aspects of Islam are taught, such as:
- Fiqh (Islamic jurisprudence; the rules and practices we follow in Islam)
- Aqīdah (learning and understanding Islamic beliefs)
- Sīrah (The biography of the Prophet Muḥammad, peace be upon him, and its relevance)
- Islamic history spans the lives of all the previous Prophets and significant events of importance.

Ādāb (Islamic manners and etiquette essential to a moral and rewarding life)

These topics are taught to cover classical knowledge and explore and explain in detail their contemporary applications and implications. This makes Islamic studies at Tanzeel a subject that is very relevant to our students' everyday lives.

Our aim is to develop our students into upright and knowledgeable Muslims who will benefit themselves, their families, and the wider community. In addition, through our teachings, we ensure that children are taught to respect and have tolerance for other people and other religions and beliefs. We encourage pupils to participate actively in the wider community and society.

Arabic Language

- Classical Arabic language is the key to better understanding the Qur'ān. At Tanzeel, we recognize its importance and have included this subject as part of our curriculum from the outset.
- Starting from the basics and moving up to the more intricate grammar rules, our course teaches all the knowledge necessary to increase understanding and insight into the Qur'ān.

Little Muslims

At this stage, students usually start from scratch or have an elementary level of understanding regarding Islamic learning. Therefore, our approach towards students in this class would be warm and welcoming to ensure the students have adapted comfortably and are used to the classroom environment. They would start by learning the basics of each of the subjects and then gradually make progress throughout.

Level 1

In Level 1, students are expected to be familiar with the basics of Qawaid and slowly transition to the Juz Amma. At this point, students are encouraged to recite with fluency and a good level of pronunciation of letters (Makhraj & Sifaat). Also, students start to memorize the intermediate-level Surahs & Duas and enhance their knowledge of Islamic Studies.

Level 2

In Level 2, the majority of the students are expected to be on Juz Amma/ Quran, and this time is crucial for students as they are now developing their recitation melody and learning how to recite the Quran according to the correct Tajweed rules. Students also memorize Surahs & Duas based on their pace and ability. During Islamic studies, students are expected to get involved in presentations and discussions to stimulate their minds to understand Islamic rules, hadith, tafsir, etc in much more depth.
